



RM Clayton Flood Repairs Underway

ATLANTA, GA (03/29/2010) - Crowder Construction Company was selected by the City of Atlanta to complete repairs to the R.M. Clayton Water Reclamation Center, which is Atlanta's largest wastewater treatment plant. In September 2009, Atlanta suffered a 500-year flooding event that submerged approximately two-thirds of the treatment facility under floodwaters from the Chattahoochee River.

Crowder Construction Company was awarded two separate contracts for the facility repairs. The first project will provide turn-key services including new field instruments, actuators and valves, which are all critical to the operation and maintenance of the facility and have an estimated repair cost of two million dollars. The second project, with an estimated cost of half a million dollars, requires remediation and repair of the overflow structure for the west CSO rip rap channel that was damaged and scoured away during the flood. This outfall structure is a critical component to the city's storm water management system.

Estimated completion of both contracts is July 2010.
